

Bi-Mart fall 2021 disruption FAQ for members

Questions and answers

Q. What is happening?

A. Bi-Mart announced all their pharmacies will either close or become Walgreens pharmacies. Their prescriptions are all moving to Walgreens, which is out of our network. (Walgreens has not been part of our network for many years.) Your prescriptions will need to move to a pharmacy in our network.

Q. When is this happening?

A. The change starts on October 18.

Q. How do I get my prescriptions?

A. You have two options:

- 1. Contact Bi-Mart and request that they transfer your prescription to a pharmacy in our network.
- 2. Ask your provider (or whoever prescribed your medicine) to write a new prescription and send it to a pharmacy in our network.

We don't know how quickly Bi-Mart can transfer prescriptions. It might be easier and faster for your provider to write another prescription, especially for new prescriptions.

Q. Can I get a one-time refill at Walgreens until I can switch?

A. No, unfortunately not. If you have an emergency, please call CareOregon at 800-224-4840 and follow prompts for the Pharmacy Department. We will see what options are available to help. We encourage you to move your prescriptions to a pharmacy in our network as soon as you can, so you will have your medicine in time.

Q. How do I find a pharmacy in the CareOregon network?

A. The table on the second page of this document shows which pharmacies are in our network and closest to the Bi-Marts that are closing. You can also search for a network pharmacy on our website: careoregon.org/find-a-provider. Choose "pharmacy" in the type of provider and search by ZIP code.

Q. Can I pay out of pocket and be reimbursed?

A. No. In most cases, your prescription won't qualify to be paid back if you pay for it.

Q. I'm a CareOregon Advantage member. Can I still use my OTC plus card at Walgreens?

A. Yes. The OTC program is a Medicare-only program and is not affected by this change. CareOregon Advantage members will still be able to use their OTC card to pay for covered items at Walgreens.

Q. What about COVID-19 vaccines?

A. In accordance with state and federal rules, you can still get the COVID-19 vaccine at all pharmacies (including Walgreens).
