

OHSU Transitional Care Programs

C-Train:

-3 nurses and 1 clinical social worker meet with pt while admitted at OHSU and assess for areas of need

-C-Train staff provide 30-90 day transitional care episode that supports underserved patients by bridging gaps in post hospital care

New Directions:

-4 clinical social workers engage adults 18 and over experiencing houselessness who are marginalized, underserved, uncoordinated and high-risk populations with high ED utilization in the Tri-County area (Minimum 5 ED visits in a rolling 12 month period.)

-Staff work to impact the effects of health inequities for historically marginalized groups by collaborating across the healthcare continuum to ensure the appropriate level and depth of care using TIC pillars

Transitional Housing Program:

-6 FTE clinical social worker and 1.0 SW Specialist who focus on medically and psychosocially vulnerable patients who experience delays to hospital discharge due to lack of safe and sanitary settings in which they can recuperate

- Staff work closely with inpatient providers to identify a post-discharge housing plan and offer hotel placement to bridge to those more long-term plans. The bridge stay can be for up to 90 days, as long as the patient is engaged with program staff and moving toward their housing and medical goals.

Collaborative Advocacy Through Community Healthcare (CATCH) Program

-A Part-Time Nurse Practitioner acts in a pre-primary care position until the pt is established in a medical home and provides oversight for care coordination and medication bridging and community visits as needed.

HCV Transitions to Treatment (TOT) Pilot Program

-A clinical social worker and a SW Specialist work to address social inequities and barriers for People Who Use Drugs (PWUD) and are infected with Hepatitis C through outreach and assertive referral pathways and engagement.

-The staff coordinate completion of laboratory and imaging and provide education as well as supporting patients to connect with treatments service resources
